







It is famous as the birthplace of the LDS Church and home to significant sites like the Sacred Grove and Hill Cumorah. With scenic canal views, vibrant annual events, and outdoor recreation, Palmyra blends history, culture, and small-town charm.



Montezuma, NY, is a small town along the Erie Canal known for its rich history and proximity to the Montezuma National Wildlife Refuge.

Once a key canal port, it played a vital role in early canal transportation and salt production. Today, it attracts nature lovers and history enthusiasts with its scenic wetlands, birdwatching

opportunities, and remnants of the original Erie Canal Lock 62.




The Montezuma National Wildlife Refuge is a wildlife
preserve operated by the United States Fish and Wildlife
Service, encompassing part of the Montezuma Swamp at
the north end of Cayuga Lake. The 10,004-acre preserve is
composed of swamps, pools and channels and is a stopping
point for migratory birds.






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Towns Heading East (Palmyra - Balwinsville)
